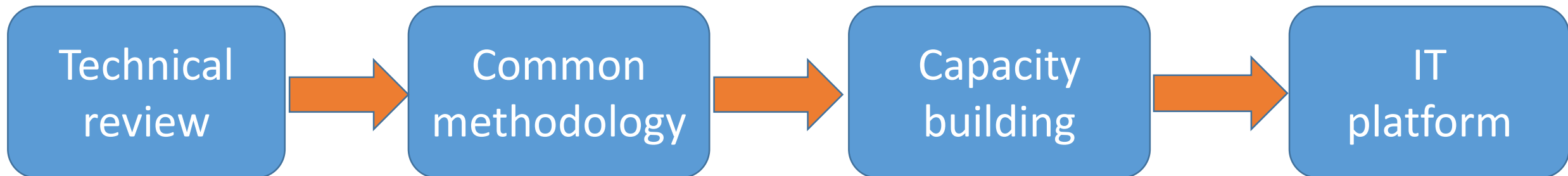

COMMAND d Project outcome:

- A system to collect/analyse data to support developing evidence-based response strategies are available;
- An IT-based solution to facilitate disaster response is available.
- **5 technical capacity reviews (February-May 2020)**
- **10 capacity building trainings**
- **1 standardized risk assessment methodology (May 2020)**
- **1 IT decision making support tool (March 2021)**

COMMAND d Methodology:

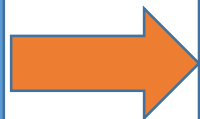


Final beneficiaries:

- COMMAND d is targeting local level authorities i.e. relevant Headquarters for Protection and Rescue
- The replication of the pre-tested idea concerning IT decision making support tool will originate from Croatia (as the EU and UCPM member state) and adapted/shared with North Macedonia and Montenegro (as UCPM countries but not EU countries) and IPA II countries namely Bosnia & Herzegovina and Albania.

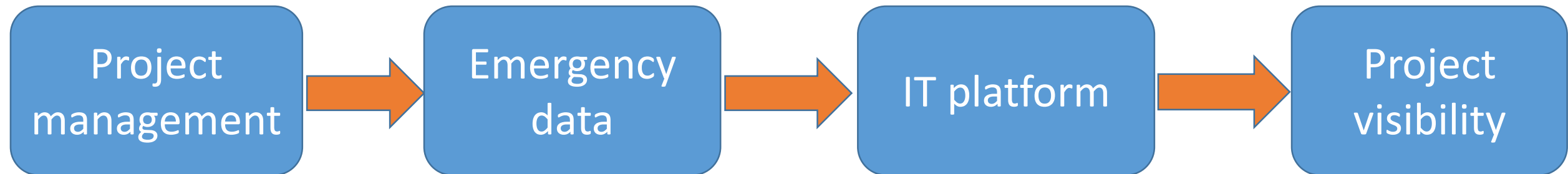

COMMAND d follow up:

- “COMMAND d” project “know-how” is to be shared from Croatia, North Macedonia and Montenegro (as the UCPM countries) with Bosnia & Herzegovina and Albania (as countries with aspiration to becoming UCPM countries).
- Since project countries are covering same geographic area (South-East Europe) “COMMAND d” project intends to share this best practice example with other local level authorities from the region.
- Final “way forward conference” will be organized to present IT emergency decision making support tool for local level Command and Operations centres) to local level authorities in South-East Europe namely Slovenia and Serbia thus by creating potential of future joint use throughout the entire region.
