OVERALL OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT

To support **Algeria, France, Italy, Malta, Monaco*, Morocco, Spain and Tunisia** in strengthening their collaboration and cooperation in the field of **preparedness for and response to oil and chemical marine pollution by**:

Increasing the efficiency of assistance provided to pollution emergencies in the Western Mediterranean region in cooperation with the civil protection, the maritime and environment administrations and international experts.

Developing a harmonised methodology to **improve the quality and interoperability of response capacities and plans**.

Gradually improving the framework of cooperation at the national level and **establish synergies between the existing Sub-regional plans** and between **the Secretariat of Regional Seas Programmes** (REMPEC, HELCOM and OSPAR/Bonn Agreement).

- Sustain and enhance the interconnection between CECIS and MedERSys for a better coordination of emergency response
- Use by all Mediterranean Coastal States of the developed tools:
 MedMRetos, mechanism for the mobilisation of response equipment and experts in case of emergency
