

EU CIVIL PROTECTION SUPPORT TO UKRAINE

The European Commission is working on all fronts to support Ukraine and its people with emergency assistance. The **EU Civil Protection Mechanism** allowed for a quick and smooth delivery of much needed in-kind assistance to Ukraine. This continuing operation is the **largest ever operation** under the EU Civil Protection Mechanism.

27 EU Member States and **Norway, Türkiye, North Macedonia** and **Iceland** offered **more than 76 500 tonnes** of items, ranging from medical supplies and shelter items to vehicles and energy equipment.

To deliver the assistance to Ukraine, the EU has set up **logistical hubs** in **Poland, Slovakia** and **Romania** to channel assistance into Ukraine as well as three humanitarian **warehouses** in **Ukraine (Vinnitsya, Dnipro and Kharkiv)**.





ENERGY ASSISTANCE

The destruction of Ukraine's energy infrastructure is reaching a critical point. On the brink of winter, people are being cut off from the electricity and heating. The EU is working around the clock to help sustain the electricity supply in Ukraine. Via the **EU Civil Protection Mechanism**, the EU Member States and participating states are delivering power generators and vital energy equipment to Ukraine.



783 electricity generators

Including 40 from the rescEU reserve, and the rest offered by 24 European countries to power homes and hospitals in Ukraine.



EMERGENCY SHELTER

Access to emergency shelter helps people have a safe and secure place to stay. This is why the European Commission has extended its reserve to include temporary shelters to rapidly host thousands of people. The shelters are equipped with key items, such as beds, blankets and heaters. Some of these items have been deployed to address the needs stemming from the war on Ukraine.

rescEU stock of 8 000 shelter units

(containers, tents and prefabricated units), was procured to be used in Ukraine and in EU Member States.

Up to date, **1 900 relief housing units** have been delivered, hosting around 9 000 people.
